



	Completion of 7 additional public art projects	4 projects completed, Remaining 3 listed on schedule. An additional project, the 9/11 Cross and Memorial was added at the request of Council and will be completed by August.



Temporary Storefront Murals on local businesses added to **Chalk the Block** to encourage attendees to patronize downtown restaurants/bars; event drew <u>41,000</u> attendees representing 28% increase in previous year's attendance.







Hosted 3 day Cobra International Cup the largest soccer tournament of the area with <u>268 teams</u>.





Aligned hours and changed location of **Holiday Downtown Art & Farmers Market** to dovetail with **Tree Lighting Ceremony**. 500% increase in visitors.



Library reached 18,640 preschoolers and their caregivers through 1,044 "Ready to Read" programs; introduced Science Matters series.

- (Opportunity) Developing new audiences and strengthening programs for Ft. Bliss families by programming half of Music Under the Stars season at Cohen Stadium.






