
Focus on Continuous Improvement

Crisis Intervention Team (CIT)


- CIT Officers operational since December 3, 2018
- EHN paired 14 specialists with the officers on February 14, 2019
- Dispatched to 1,511 patrol calls
- 256 Emergency Detention Orders
- 55 people voluntarily referred to suitable facilities
- 98 mental health reports completed



EPPD Replacement Vehicles

- FY2019 Delivery of **150** vehicles started in February 2019; estimated completion in August 2019
- Currently 56% of the marked fleet is 2017 or newer
- Estimate that by 8/31/19, 92% of the marked fleet will be 2017 or newer
- 18 new motorcycles received, currently being equipped



Strategy: Take proactive approaches to prevent fire/medical incidents and lower regional risk

Promote and improve fire prevention through education

- 1,108 smoke alarms installed
- 820 household with home evacuation plans
- 79% of Public and Private schools contacted
- 92% of property saved for all structure fires







Increase Acute Myocardial Infarction survivability

- 43% of cardiac arrest patients where compression CPR was initiated prior to arrival
- 24% of cardiac arrest patients delivered to the hospital with ROSC
- 2,907 Immunizations and Health Screenings provided thru Community Health and Safety Initiative



Strategy: Increase public safety operational efficiency

Maintain an Effective Response Force to efficiently handle fire and medical emergency calls

- 90% of fire and medical emergency calls with a total Response Time of 8:30
- 75% Fires contained to the room of origin

Increase 911 Communication Center operational efficiency

95% of 911 calls answered within 15 seconds


- Additional Academies have allowed the PD to start addressing critical staffing needs:
 - Crisis Intervention Team: 14 officers, 3 sergeants, 1 lieutenant
 - Gang Suppression Unit: 15 officers, 1 sergeant
 - Vice/Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC)

Drones

- Currently 5 certified pilots, 12 more in training
- Policy in final stages of completion
- Once policy is complete, unit will begin flying missions
- Drones will be utilized to assist with searches of remote areas and could be utilized with crime scene diagrams for CSU and STI.
