

Milestones



The City of El Paso and the BBB established the Buy El Paso website in September 2020 to showcase local small businesses; furthermore, Buy El Paso Day is celebrated on the first Saturday in December to support and encourage shopping local.

The City of El Paso was selected to participate in the Aspen Institute Latinos and Society's first cohort of cities for the Latino Business and Entrepreneurship Initiative. The initiative convened local ESO's to coalesce around strategic priorities and implement solutions to boost and sustain the local business economy.

Grant recipient of the National League of Cities (NLC) City Inclusive Entrepreneurship Program. We bridged the access to capital gap by connecting small business owners to Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFI).

Milestones



The City of El Paso is proactively fostering business growth and addressing financial gaps across diverse industries by establishing a state-of-the-art Business One Stop Shop. This innovative center will serve as a hub for comprehensive support, providing resources, guidance and opportunities for businesses to thrive in the local economy.

The Aspen Institute and Drexel University collaborate on Supply El Paso, reimagining local procurement for small businesses. Tailored interventions aim to overcome challenges and foster growth through integrated ecosystems. Preliminary findings on El Paso's procurement economy will be shared, providing insights to leverage investments for local business growth.

The Hunt Institute for Global
Competitiveness, was commissioned by
the City of El Paso to conduct a thorough
survey of small businesses in the area. With
over 316 small businesses participating,
the survey aimed to identify areas of
strength and improvement to enhance the
overall experience for local enterprises that
engage with the BOSS.

In 2022 roundtables with CDFI's and small businesses were connected to provide technical assistance with *Access to Capital* providing the resources and support to help entrepreneurs achieve greater economic mobility, reduce the racial wealth gap and improve access, opportunity, knowledge and funding.

In 2023 by NLC awarded us a grant to identify obstacles facing Hispanic entrepreneurs and small business owners. We utilized the grant to provide a payroll service; Roll $^{\text{m}}$ by ADP $^{\text{m}}$, where small business proprietors can access chat-based payroll services through a free one-year subscription.











Twenty-five licenses were acquired for business payroll with the help of a \$10,000 grant.
