City of El Paso and El Paso Water Host Community Meetings about Impact Fees

EL PASO, **Texas**—The City of El Paso and EPWater are hosting a series of community meetings to discuss proposed changes to impact fees, which were implemented in 2009 as a way for the costs of growth to be paid by developers rather than all EPWater ratepayers.

Impact fees are charges assessed on new development to fund the cost of water and wastewater infrastructure necessary to support that development. Impact fees are only charged to construction of new homes and buildings within impact fee zones in certain new areas on the city.

Staff from EPWater and the City will be on hand to speak on the history of impact fees, the areas of growth where impact fees are assessed and the capital improvements that will be funded with impact fees.

The Mayor and City Council will hold a public hearing during the regular City Council meeting at 9 a.m. Tuesday, April 23, 2024, before voting on the proposed changes to the impact fees.
