AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 8262
(ESTABLISHING THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON
BORDER RELATIONS, DEFINING ITS POWERS AND DUTIES,
PROVIDING FOR ITS APPOINTMENT, STRUCTURE, TERM OF
OFFICE, FILLING OF VACANCIES) TO PROVIDE FOR SEVEN
RATHER THAN FIFTEEN MEMBERS AND DELETING THE ROLE
OF THE GREATER EL PASO CIVIC, VISITORS AND CONVENTION BUREAU

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 8262 established the standing
Committee on Border Relations, required by the City Charter of
the City of El Paso adopted in January of 1984;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF EL PASO:

That Ordinance No. 8262 is hereby amended to read as
follows:

I.

There is hereby established the Committee on Border
Relations, consisting of seven citizens of the City of El Paso
who shall be appointed in the manner provided for in Section 3.7B
of the Charter relating to appointments to boards and
commissions. The Council shall ensure that the seven members
represent a broad section of the community including members of
business, educational, cultural and civic organizations. At the
first meeting of the Committee on Border Relations, the terms of
office for all seven members will be determined by choosing lots
so that three members shall serve for one-year terms and four
members shall serve for two-year terms. Upon the expiration of
initial terms, and thereafter, all appointments shall be for
two-year terms.

II

The Committee shall elect from among its members a Chair and a Vice-Chair, to serve in the absence of the Chair, and it shall adopt, subject to the approval of the City Council, such rules and regulations governing its proceedings as it may deem proper. Such rules and regulations shall not be inconsistent with the Charter and Ordinances of the City. The Director of the Department of Economic Development shall act as secretary of the Committee, and shall keep a record of all transactions of the Committee and provide it with necessary information and staff support for the performance of its duties.

III

The Committee, in connection with appropriate City departments and with interested organizations and individuals in El Paso and Ciudad Juarez, shall consider issues and projects affecting the development or relations between the two communities, and the border and in proximity to El Paso, and shall make recommendations to the City Council on programs or projects to enhance and benefit the relations between the two communities. Further, the Board shall make such other reports and recommendations to the City Council in connection with the program as Council may require.




