The El Paso Fire Department Wants to Remind the Public to Check Their Fire Extinguishers Recent recall heightens importance to check devices

EL PASO, Texas – The start of the New Year is a great time to once again examine and inspect your home safety devices like smoke alarms and fire extinguishers. In light of a recent recall, the El Paso Fire Department (EPFD) wants to stress to the community the importance of inspecting your home fire extinguishers.

Kidde, a large manufacture of fire safety products has recalled two styles of fire extinguishers, plastic handle fire extinguishers and push-button Pindicator fire extinguishers. Hazards include:

- Fire extinguishers that can become clogged or require excessive force to discharge and can fail to activate during a fire emergency.
- In addition, the nozzle can detach with enough force to pose an impact hazard.
