A Hit and Run Pedestrian Traffic Collision with Serious Injuries is Being Handled by Special Traffic Investigators

Date & Time: Saturday, June 17, 2017 @ 7:44 a.m.
Location: 6000 Cleveland and Clark
Pedestrian: 68-year old Male
Vehicle: faded black 1990's model sports car
Driver: Male

EL PASO, TEXAS: The El Paso Police Department's Special Traffic Investigation (STI) unit responded to assist Central Patrol officers with a non-fatal traffic collision that involved a vehicle and pedestrian. The preliminary investigation revealed that the driver of a black sports car (possibly Honda Civic, 2 doors, with possible front end damage) was north on Cleveland at a high rate of speed and ran the stop sign at the intersection with Clark. At the same time a pedestrian was crossing southbound on Clark St., and was struck by the vehicle. The vehicle fled the scene. The pedestrian suffered life threatening injuries and was transported to University Medical Center for treatment.
