<u>Texas Legislature</u>- The Texas Legislative Online (TLO) system is an internet application that enables the public to view the status of legislation and provides the ability to search bill text, amendment text, and bill information. TLO was first made available in 1997 for the 75th Legislature and has been enhanced each session since.
