


42,060 people were killed in preventable traffic crashes in the U.S. in 2020.










Traffic fatalities, 2012-2018




SAFE SYSTEM

Project Overview



Our Charge

The El Paso City Council unanimously approved a Vision Zero resolution that sets an aggressive goal to eliminate all traffic deaths and serious injuries and rethink street design to protect the most vulnerable road users.



Our Approach



Humanize traffic deaths



Set feasible, timeconstrained goals



Gather live input & test solutions



Build consensus



Build upon current efforts



Develop implementation toolkit

Project Scope



Gather a broad range of community input on roadway safety and behaviors, especially the needs of vulnerable users.



Locate the roadway segments with the most severe and fatal injury crashes.



Identify a set of tools that El Paso can use to improve safety across the transportation network.







UNDERSTAND CRASH FACTORS

Understand which factors contribute to crashes in El Paso – especially severe and fatal crashes.

PREPARE FOR FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Set El Paso up for future funding opportunities to implement safety countermeasures.




