## Public Libraries Receives Grant to Provide English as a Second Language Classes

EL PASO, Texas — The City of El Paso is pleased to announce that the El Paso Public Libraries received a grant of approximately \$4,000 from the Texas State Library and Archives Commission (TSLAC) that will provide free English as a Second Language (ESL) classes to residents.

Beginning this month, FREE ESL classes will be available from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. every Tuesday at the Irving Schwartz, Enrique Moreno, and Westside branch libraries.

"With this grant the Public Libraries further empowers our community by offering vital services such as these free ESL programs," said El Paso Public Libraries Director Norma Martinez. "It is with these types of programs that we are able to foster inclusivity, education, and cultural enrichment for all, ensuring a brighter and more connected future not only for the individual, but the community as a whole."

The library used part of the Texas Read Grant to train and certify six library staff members with the Teaching English as a Foreign Language certification (TEFL). The remaining funds will be used to purchase books to plan lessons for ESL classes.
