- 3. Watch Holiday Plants: Some festive plants, like poinsettias and mistletoe, can be toxic to pets. Keep them out of reach or opt for pet-safe alternatives.
- 4. Mind the Wires: Tape down or secure any exposed wires from holiday lights to prevent pets from chewing on them, which could result in electric shock.

- 8. Limit Table Scraps: While it's tempting to share holiday feasts with your pets, be cautious about feeding them table scraps, as certain foods can be harmful to them.
- 9. Schedule Regular Exercise: Maintain your pet's regular exercise routine to help manage holiday stress and prevent them from becoming anxious or bored by providing stimulating enrichment sessions.
