City Invites Residents to Declutter Homes

Communitywide Cleanups Happening Saturday, May 3, 2025

EL PASO, Texas—The City of El Paso Environmental Services Department is hosting a citywide cleanup on Saturday, May 3, 2025, offering residents the opportunity to dispose of large, unwanted household items.

Roll-off dumpsters will be strategically placed throughout the community for residents to use between 8 a.m. and noon.

This initiative aims to assist in decluttering homes and yards by providing an accessible way for residents to dispose of bulky items that do not fit in curbside collection bins.

Dumpster Locations:

- **Central / Mission Valley:** Hidden Valley Park, 200 Coconut Tree Ln.
- **East Side:** Near Zaragoza Ave. and Gambusino Ave.
- **East Side / Mission Valley:** Ralph T. Cloud Park, 7975 Williamette Ave.
- **Northeast:** Near Marcus Uribe Drive and Benny Emler Dr.
- **Downtown / South Central / West Central:** Chihuahua Recreation Center, 417 Charles Rd.
- **West Side / Upper Valley:** Near Ethel Road and Edgar Rd.

“We are bringing dumpsters to neighborhoods around the City because these types of cleanups are great way to beautify our neighborhoods and boost community pride,” said Nick Ybarra, Environmental Services Director. “We invite residents to use this opportunity to do some spring cleaning and get rid of unwanted items cluttering their homes and yards.”

ITEMS ACCEPTED IN THE DUMPSTERS AT THE CLEANUPS

- Extra Household Trash
- Furniture
- Carpet
- Lumber, Wood Pallets
- Textiles (Clothing, Sheets, Towels)
- Yard waste (grass clippings, tree trunks, and other green waste)

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED IN THE DUMPSTERS

Due to environmental and health concerns, the following items will not be accepted. These can be disposed of at Citizen Collection Stations (CCS). For more details, including CCS locations and a full list of acceptable items, please visit the Environmental Services website.

- Household Hazardous Waste
- Commercial / Construction Waste
- Concrete / Rocks / Dirt
- Tires and Rims
- Mattresses and Appliances
- Used Electronics and Batteries
