El Paso Museum of Art to Host Latinx Muralism Exchange

EL PASO, Texas—The El Paso Museum of Art (EPMA) has opened free registration for a three-day convening titled Latinx Muralism Exchange: El Paso, TX and Los Angeles, CA.

The event takes place May 22 to May 24, 2025 at EPMA, located at One Arts Festival Plaza, and is made possible through a convening grant from the Terra Foundation for American Art.

"Murals play a special role in our communities. Their beauty can stop us in our tracks, and their messages can inspire reflection and preserving cultural memory," said El Paso Museum of Art Director Edward Hayes. "El Paso and the Borderland region have a rich tradition of muralism, which we share with cities like Los Angeles. We are delighted to bring artists, curators, and community leaders from both cities together to celebrate *muralismo fronterizo* at the El Paso Museum of Art and surrounding neighborhoods."

The convening is free and includes talks, panel discussions, workshops, mural tours, and networking opportunities. Events will be centered at the museum, with walking tours and El Paso Streetcar rides highlighting local murals. Registration is required; participants can register here.

In addition to the Terra Foundation for American Art, this project is supported by the Wilma Moleen Foundation, the Mellon Foundation, and the El Paso Museum of Art Foundation.

Founded in 1978, the Terra Foundation for American Art—based in Chicago and Paris—supports organizations and individuals locally and globally with the aim of fostering intercultural dialogues and encouraging transformative practices that expand narratives of American art, through the foundation's grant program, collection, and initiatives.
