



# El Paso Unveils Draft Regional Climate Action Plan and Local Pilot Project Showcase

Community Invited to Explore the Plan and Share Input

**El Paso, TX** — The City of El Paso invites residents to the unveiling of the Draft Regional Climate Action Plan and an accompanying showcase of innovative climate pilot projects developed by regional partners, local youth, and community members.

Two in-person community open houses will feature an overview of the draft plan, interactive opportunities for public input, and a hands-on display of local pilot projects led by Chihuahuan Desert Climate Collaborative (CDCC) Climate Fellows, young leaders working directly with neighborhood groups to bring climate solutions to life in El Paso.

“These projects show how climate action is already happening in our neighborhoods,” said Fernando Liaño Berjano, Senior Climate Program Manager for the City of El Paso. “From air quality monitoring to community education, the Fellows are demonstrating what’s possible—and we want the community’s feedback to ensure the final plan reflects local needs and vision.”

This launch marks the fifth and final phase of public engagement in developing the Regional Climate Action Plan, a roadmap for building a healthier, more sustainable, and economically vibrant El Paso.
