WIC Program Improves Services "Split Tender" makes WIC purchases easier, more efficient

EL PASO, Texas – Participants in the Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Program are able to use two forms of payment in order to purchase items approved under the program.

The more than 75 approved local food vendors that accept the WIC program electronic benefit transactions (EBT) card now have the capability to do a "split tender" transaction.

For example, if a WIC participant is seeking to purchase \$12 worth of fresh fruits and vegetables, but only has \$8 worth of benefits available in their EBT card, the store now has a mechanism in place to accept the additional \$4, in either Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits or cash to make up the difference.

"This system makes the point of sale transaction easier for our participants and also allows them to use up all the food benefits the WIC program provides," said Bertha Amaya, WIC Patient Services Coordinator. "In the past it would be difficult, if not nearly impossible, for a client to reach a balance of zero dollars and zero cents in their account. That is no longer the case," she said.

Officials also say there will be fewer lane issues for participants, because there will no longer be a need to put back an item if the participant goes over their EBT balance.
